


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

From the modern Church of San Fiorano, characterized by the peculiar portal designed by the artist (from Villasanta) Giovanni Colombo, walking along Mameli Road you will reach the **Sport Center "M. Castoldi"** and the theatre building Astrolabio. Exiting the sport center you will walk along the Cemetery and cross Risorgimento Avenue, turning to the right will lead you to a pedestrian crossing, which eventually ends in a farm named Cascina Recalcate. This building, erected in the XVII century, still preserves several Votive **Aedicules and the ruins of an old baker's furnace**. Going back to the entrance of Cascina Recalcate, Menotti Street begins and after a few meters Dei Mille Road is crossed again; going right at the crossing, the road continues on a flyover ending in Cavallera Park, which is part of Concorezzo. Following the dirt road alongside the crops, after a new flyover, you will enter in another farmstead, **Cascina Autunno**, and, by Boschi Road cycling lane, you will go back to Risorgimento Avenue in Villasanta. Taking San Fiorano Road you will meet many yards and farmsteads, some of them with wells dated back to the end of XIX century. Eventually, you will arrive to an Ancient Boundary Marker dated back to the Roman Empire, pointing the way to Oreno-Vimercate; turning left from there, allows you to get back to the Church Square.
